New London Architecture (NLA) is inviting submissions of London tall buildings that showcase the very best examples of design quality – from residential towers to office buildings to hotels or other mix of uses; buildings of 20 storeys or above, recently completed or at design and construction stage.

The call out forms part of the NLA London Tall Buildings Survey 2019, an annual report that analyses the tall buildings pipeline in London, which launches in Spring 2019. The report will be accompanied by a project showcase of the most recent tall buildings in London.

A selection of the submissions will be exhibited in a two-month public exhibition in the NLA Galleries at The Building Centre, WC1, and will form the backdrop to a supporting programme of events, including conferences, talks, debates and building visits.

ENTRY CRITERIA

All submissions should be located in Greater London

All projects must be 20 storeys or above, and can be at any stage of design or construction or recently completed

Completed projects should have reached practical completion within the last 5 years (since November 2013) or be currently in design, planning or construction.

USEFUL INFORMATION



Payment will only be required for submissions successfully selected for inclusion. NLA will confirm whether your submission has been selected for inclusion in the project showcase within six weeks of the closing date. On confirmation that your submission has been selected, NLA will invite you to make the payments by invoice, issued to Pipers Projects Ltd. Payment terms are strictly 14 days from invoice date

NLA Partners, charities and not-for-profit organisations are entitled to submit projects for free

All selected projects will feature in the Tall Buildings project showcase, and a small number of these will appear in the curated narrative of the exhibition, allowing for curatorial discretion

Submitters must secure appropriate permissions from the client prior to submission

There is no limit to the number of submissions from any one organisation, however the submitter is encouraged to consult with other team members to avoid duplicate submissions

Entrants agree that NLA are granted non-exclusive reproduction rights to all successful submissions for NLA's advertising, promotion, exhibition, print publication and internet purposes directly related to the Tall Buildings programme. Entrants must have permission from the photographer for the reproduction of all imagery for use relating to these purposes

RESEACH CONTEXT



Tall buildings are increasingly becoming part of London, a city traditionally associated with a low-rise, low-density character. In the past few years, major clusters of tall buildings have been taking shape across London - from Nine Elms to Elephant and Castle, to the Isle of Dogs and Croydon. With a pipeline of over 500 tall buildings either in planning, approved or under construction, as revealed by the 2018 NLA London Tall Buildings Survey, London is expected to see more of these clusters built over the next decade.

With a rapidly changing skyline and city shape, questions remain over the contribution of tall buildings in the capital: do we have the appropriate tools to ensure tall buildings are in the right place and of good quality design? How do tall buildings contribute to the streetscape, providing good quality public realm as part of their developments? And how can we make sure that tall buildings address London's housing challenge?

NLA conducts an annual survey to evaluate current trends for tall buildings in the capital, capturing the pipeline of buildings of 20 stories or above across all London Boroughs. The 2019 report will update on the current tall buildings pipeline, analysing the changes over the past year, reflecting upon the affect of Brexit, as well as discussing the appropriateness of the planning tools currently in use and ultimately discussing the role of tall buildings in London's growth.

The annual survey will be accompanied by a showcase of the recently completed and proposed tall buildings in London and a two-month exhibition at the NLA Gallery, with a launch in March 2019.
